
International contingency management handbook

- Implemented from Timetable period 2019
- Standards for continuation of traffic flows at an international disruption
- process for international business continuity management

Park or run tool – Dispatching of freight trains in disrupted situations

- Piloting until end of 2018
- Identify trains directly affected by an interruption
- Online communication between affected IMs and RUs

Definition of an international disruption





We as railway undertakings have to focus on four crucial measures to improve the system for our customers

The European rail patchwork must become one single rail system

Become easier



- Easier access to diversions abroad
 - 1. Harmonize operational rules and procedures
 - 2. Introduce a second language

Think broader



- Enhance the corridor thinking
- going beyond today's corridor definition
- implement an international crisis management on corridors

Be prepared



- Concepts have to be prepared to be much faster in such events
- infrastructure has to be upgraded to create more capacity on diversions ...
- infrastructure works have to be harmonized and coordinated
